- A. It is recommended that the Board of School Directors approves the Senior High School, Junior High School, Reiffon, and Elementary (K-4) handbooks for distribution to students.

- B. It is recommended that the Board of School Directors approves the agreement with Reading Area Community College to continue to offer dual enrollments to the students of Exeter Township Senior High School. The agreement contains the following changes from last year's agreement: *(Attachment VIII.B)*
- Participants will be charged the prevailing tuition rate of \$117 per credit (last year was \$109), but will not be charged any fees.
 - Clearer guidelines about evaluation of syllabi and student readiness.
- C. It is recommended that the Board of School Directors approves the agreement with The Progressions Companies, Inc., to place a Master's level therapist at the Senior High School in order to provide mental health services to the students identified by the school as needing services pursuant to the Student Assistance Program and whose family or guardian has completed the intake process. This satellite office would open at the beginning of the 2014-2015 school year. Progressions will be responsible for all costs.
- D. It is recommended that the Board of School Directors approves the adoption of a Settlement Agreement and Release in a sum not to exceed \$15,000, which is representative of existing and future tuition fees effective the beginning of the 2014-2015 school year through the conclusion of the 2014-2015 school year, for student #150335 in a form acceptable to the Solicitor, to provide for exceptional student's education, settle and compromise all claims raised by the student and parents, and authorize the Board President and Secretary to execute that Settlement Agreement and Release on behalf of the District.
